The name, Wakodahatchee, is derived from the Seminole Indian Language and translates as "created waters."



The created waters at Wakodahatchee Wetlands are an example of people giving something back to nature. Fifty acres of unused utilities land have been transformed into a wetlands ecosystem.

Bring your binoculars and camera.
Wildlife will be abundant
More than 140 different species of birds have been spotted at the site.
You will see alligators, too.
There is no admission fee
Boardwalk is wheelchair accessible

Boardwalks wind through three of the wetland's ponds, allowing visitors the opportunity to read interpretive signs and learn about water purification, wetlands ecology, natural history, and the interdependence of people and their environment.
